

The Town of Dover Town Board held a regular meeting at 6:30 pm on Wednesday, February 22, 2017 at the Dover Town Hall, 126 East Duncan Hill Road, Dover Plains, NY with the following members present:

#### CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor French called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Everyone stood for the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### WHITE PINE COMMUNITY FARM

Mr. Ben Schwartz and Mr. Phil Urner, co-owners of White Pine Farm, provided a short presentation about the Farm For All/ White Pine Community Farm initiative along with a PowerPoint presentation of farm photographs and samples of farm-produced herbal teas. The 47-acre farm produces herbs, vegetables, mushrooms, garlic and honey with future plans to offer duck eggs and goat milk products. Over the past few years, the farm owners have hosted and participated in numerous community and school events to promote local fresh food security and sustainability. Mr. Schwartz and Mr. Urner invited the community to attend a Spring Equinox Observance on Sunday, March 19tj at the farm located at the intersection of Duell Hollow Rd. and Route 55 in Wingdale from 12 to 6 p.m. that will include an Equinox ceremony, farm tours, potluck meal and entertainment. Town Board members thanked the presenters and wished them great success in their efforts.

### JIM MUNCEY \_ BERKSHIRE ROAD

Mr. Jim Muncey, owner of the Ten Mile River Preserve, addressed the Town Board regarding concerns about the road conditions and maintenance of Berkshire Road, a town road, traveled throughout the year by residents and guests of the Preserve. Mr. Muncey urged the Town Board to consider closing the road due to ongoing incidents in winter where motorists become disabled due to road conditions and continuous unlawful dumping of debris.

Highway Superintendent Graham responded to Mr. Muncey's concerns and stated that further road maintenance would be performed in the spring. She reiterated that closing the road would reduce the Town's annual allocation of Consolidated Highway Improvement Program funding.

Discussion ensued about the need for clarification of the road's status on currently posted signage and the Supervisor asked Superintendent Graham to address this immediately.

Attorney Jacobellis agreed to contact the legal department of the NYS Dept. of Transportation (DOT) to inquire about a waiver for seasonal closure of the road. It was agreed that the Highway Department would continue to maintain the road at this time until further information was obtained from the NYS DOT.

### CRICKET VALLEY ENERGY CENTER UPDATE

Town Engineer Berger reported on his observations of demolition progress at the site over the past two weeks. He reported that demolition would be completed by mid-June and 2017 project goals included transportation infrastructure, installation of lighting, storm sewers, finish foundations and footings. He confirmed that weekly progress and safety meetings were on schedule and manifests of debris removal were well-documented and demonstrative of a transparent process.

He reported other highlights of the project included outreach to NYS DOT for Route 22 signage and preparation of applications for permits for road improvements. It was anticipated that 2nd and 3rd shift of employees working in the site would likely commence in 2018. A security guard and guardhouse were now in service on site. He mentioned a phone number would be posted on Cricket Valley Energy's website for residents and the public to obtain further information on the status of demolition.

In response to a Town Board member's question regarding opportunities for local employment, Engineer Berger reported the construction contractor, some project consultants and the security and tree removal companies currently involved in the project were based on Dutchess County. Town Board members thanked Mr. Berger for his update.

<u>Deputy Supervisor Yeno</u> received Building Department updates on projects and announced the new part-time employment opportunity for a Town Fire Safety Inspector/ Code Enforcement Officer. He urged residents and the public to contact him by phone or email with questions or concerns regarding the status of town projects.

<u>Supervisor French</u> announced a new monthly Supervisor's Open House/Office Hours on the second Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at Dover Town Hall. She invited residents to contact her by email, phone or speak with her in-person for information about town and land use projects. She mentioned the following upcoming town events:

- Dover Greens/Olivet University campus improvements were underway with permits and inspections being conducted by the Building Inspector and other professionals as required. (\*Town Clerk's Note: Please see the January 25, 2017 Town Board Meeting Minutes for a summary of a presentation made by Dover Greens about campus renovations and improvements).
- Electricity production of the future Cricket Valley Energy Center will be supplied to the national grid for state and regional electricity allocation service and needs.
- The Town's Comprehensive Plan Update including proposed zoning changes to promote new economic development was well underway with Dutchess County Planning's assistant and moving toward completion.

Ms. Whaley-Avery commended the 2016 Dover Community Day Committee, and in particular, Julie Muncey, for efforts in coordinating a very successful event. Town Board members thanked her for attending the meeting and invited residents and the public to attend future Town Board meetings to receive answers to their questions and concerns.
